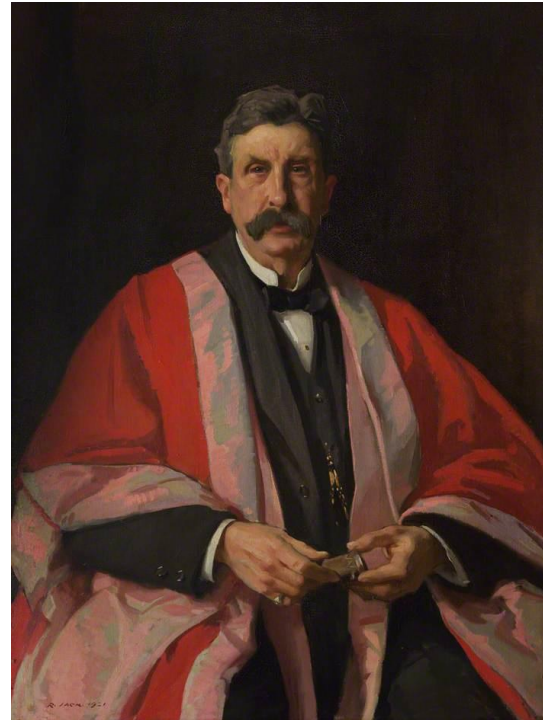

Biographical and Other Notes

Born in King's County, Ulster and educated at Portarlinton School and Trinity College Dublin. Professor of Archaeology at Cambridge, with a wide range of interests. One of his best-known works was a study on the origins of weight systems and metallic currency. *The Origin of Metallic Currency and Weight Standards*, 1892. A few notes in NC. His bequest to the Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology included a few coins. Other works by Ridgeway include *The Origin and Influence of the Thoroughbred Horse*, 1905, and *Who were the Romans?* 1907.
