

## Biographical and Other Notes

Became a second lieutenant in the Tyne Division of the Royal Engineers on 15 August 1891. Later a stockbroker from Newcastle upon Tyne, living in Jesmond. His collection of English and Irish coins, seventeenth century tokens, medals, tickets, passes etc. was sold in 381 lots by Sotheby's on 15-16 July 1907. The 4,000 17<sup>th</sup> C tokens had been chosen for quality over quantity and had provenances such as: Boyne, Smallwood, Gill (the Devonshire pieces), Caswell (Lincolnshire), and Fewster (the city of York portion). Collection of local tokens,

medals, library and house auctioned in Newcastle upon Tyne in 1925. Collection of British, Romano British, Anglo-Saxon etc. sold Glendining 22-23 January 1925.
