Biographical and Other Notes

Born in Sicily to a family of artisans he moved to Rome and after a self-taught period, he completed his training at the Art School for the Design of Medals in Roma and initially specialising in medals and woodcuts. In 1923 he won the competition for the two-lira coin. He took part in the design competition for the coinage of Eire in 1927. His animal designs were used in subsequent Italian medals. His work was part of the sculpture event in the art competition at the 1936 Summer Olympics.
