Biographical and Other Notes

Born Leicester, Educated at Merton College, Oxford, BA 1771, MA 1775, BD 1782. In 1793 he was presented by his college to the vicarage of Maldon, and was afterwards elected a fellow of the Society of Antiquaries, London; he was also an honorary member of the Philosophical Society of Newcastle-upon-Tyne. Died Maldon Surrey.

Various notes and queries (asked and answered) in Gentleman's Magazine from 1790.

4th edition of 'Annals' remains a classic in indispensable text.
