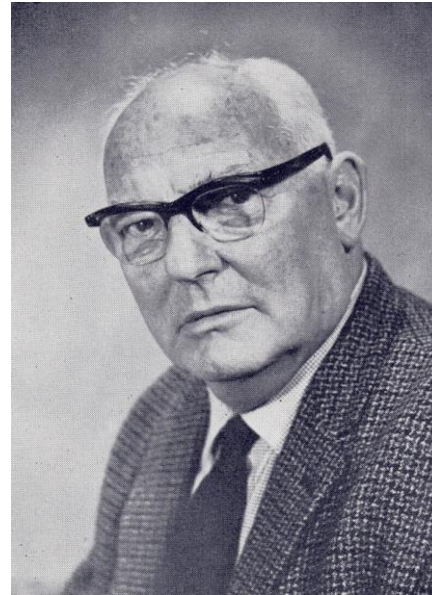

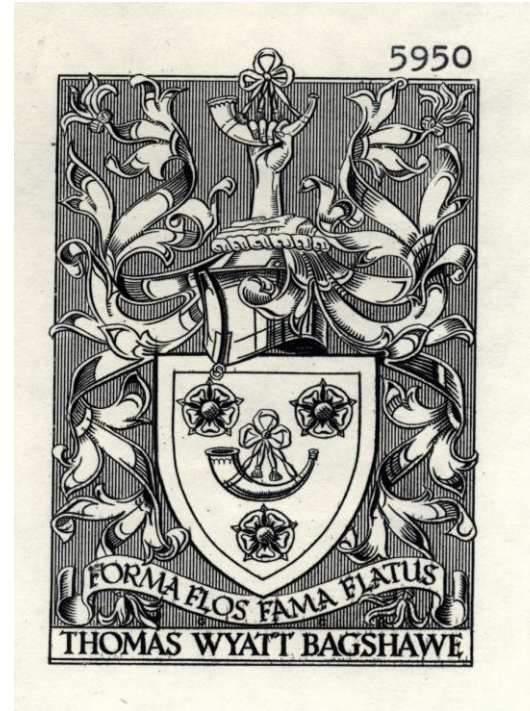

Biographical and Other Notes

Thomas Wyatt Bagshawe was the younger son of the founder of an engineering company in Dunstable. He abandoned his academic studies to take part in an expedition to Graham Land in 1920-22. He was an avid collector, and his early collections formed the nucleus of what is now the Luton Museum at Wardown Park, and his library became the Local Studies collection of Bedford Central Library. He sold his collection of Anglo-Saxon pennies through Spinks and his son Nicholas Thomas Bagshawe sold his 233 Bedfordshire 17th century tokens through Glendining's in 2000.
