## Biographical and Other Notes

Mineralogist and antiquary of Menabilly House, Fowey, Cornwall. Published pioneering catalogue of British Minerals in 1797. MP, sat continuously 1765-1802 when he retired, known as the father of the House. In the second half of the 18<sup>th</sup>C he had a collection of British coins including Anglo-Saxon pennies from the Trehiddle hoard. Buyer at many of the big sales of the time, including Tyssen. The collection ultimately went to his great nephew Jonathan Rashleigh who further expanded the collection. Ultimately sold in 1909.
