



Biographical and Other Notes

James Conder, was born at Mile End, London on 22 October 1761, youngest of seven sons of Revd John Conder (1714-1781) of Cambridgeshire, tutor at Homerton, and his wife Susan, daughter of John Flindell, leather merchant of Ipswich. With his brother Joseph, James left London in 1788 and took over the drapery business of James Vaughn at Southampton. In 1789, he came to Ipswich where his elder brother John, lived with the Flindells and who succeeded to the Flindells' leather business, and took Dobson's linen & woollen, drapery business near the White Horse in Tavern Street, Ipswich which in 1790, he moved to the Contributors to British Numismatics

corner of the Fruit Market also in Tavern Street. Extensive collection of 18th C tokens, including many varieties of his own created for collectors, and a pioneering catalogue of the series which sometimes carries his name. Collection sold at Sotheby's in 1855.
