

COIN HOARDS FROM THE BRITISH ISLES 2018

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BETWEEN 1975 and 1985 the Royal Numismatic Society published summaries of coin hoards from the British Isles and elsewhere in its serial publication *Coin Hoards*, and in 1994 this was revived as a separate section in the *Numismatic Chronicle*. In recent years the listing of finds from England, Wales and Northern Ireland in *Coin Hoards* was principally derived from reports originally prepared for publication in the *Treasure Annual Report*, but the last hoards published in this form were those reported under the 1996 Treasure Act in 2008. In 2012 it was decided to publish summaries of hoards from England, Wales, Scotland, the Isle of Man, Northern Ireland, the Republic of Ireland and the Channel Islands in the *British Numismatic Journal* on an annual basis.

The information provided for each hoard consists of the place of finding, the date(s) of discovery, the suggested date(s) of deposition, the number allocated to the hoard when it was reported under the terms of the Treasure Act (in England and Wales) or the laws of Treasure Trove (in Scotland), and a summary of its contents. Reports on most of the English and Welsh hoards listed are available online from the Portable Antiquities Scheme (PAS) website: select the 'Search our database' bar under *finds.org.uk/database*, and type in the PAS database ID provided (e.g. HAMP-EAD937) or the treasure case number without spaces (e.g. 2017T132).

Iron Age and Roman hoards

The listing below gives summary details of eighty-six Iron Age and Roman coin hoards reported on for the Treasure process during 2017. Full catalogues of the hoards are attached to the relevant Portable Antiquities Scheme database records (made public at the end of the Treasure process) or available at the British Museum pending online publication. The high number of hoards reported is a reflection of the general trend of increasing numbers of hoards reported under the Treasure Act 1996 in recent years and is a significant increase on the sixty-five listed in last year's round-up.

The hoards are a fairly typical cross-section of British finds, with high numbers of Iron Age hoards, early and late Roman precious metal hoards and late third-century radiate hoards. The twenty-two Iron Age hoards have a broad geographical spread and are dominated by smaller hoards of mid first century BC uninscribed coinage; an exception is the large hoard of North-Eastern inscribed coinage from Riseholme, Lincolnshire, and an unusual mixed hoard of Iron Age and Roman coinage from Cornwall. There are four new small *denarius* hoards that appear to pre-date the Roman conquest, and an addendum to a fifth.

The late third-century radiate hoards include several hoards of over 1,000 coins. Two of these, Barlaston and Stoke Lyne, were found in two separate deposits. The hoards from Barlaston, Staffordshire, both have a *terminus post quem* of AD 276 and are broadly similar in composition, apart from Barlaston II having a higher proportion of coins of Postumus and Victorinus and lower proportion of coins of the Tetrici compared to Barlaston I (reported in the previous *BNJ*). Whilst the latter contained a small number of post-reform radiates, Barlaston II lacks such coinage and is only dated by a copy with an obverse prototype of Florian. The Stoke Lyne I and II hoards from Oxfordshire have different terminal dates, AD 274 and 271 respectively. The presence of irregular coinage in Stoke Lyne and later third-century coins in the surrounding soil could suggest a later deposition date. In both cases the finders adhered to best practice and allowed the hoard containers to be lifted and excavated in the British Museum conservation laboratory to ascertain the presence of any internal stratigraphy. This was not apparent in

these cases but was observed in the hoard of 2,114 radiates from Piddletrenthide, Dorset.

The list of hoards ends with a number of small *siliqua* hoards from the end of the Roman period. A number of these are addenda to previously reported hoards and present a high degree of clipping, suggesting a deposition date some time later than the latest dated coins.
