

COIN HOARDS FROM THE BRITISH ISLES 2015

EDITED BY RICHARD ABDY, MARTIN ALLEN AND JOHN NAYLOR

BETWEEN 1975 and 1985 the Royal Numismatic Society published summaries of coin hoards from the British Isles and elsewhere in its serial publication *Coin Hoards*, and in 1994 this was revived as a separate section in the *Numismatic Chronicle*. In recent years the listing of finds from England, Wales and Northern Ireland in *Coin Hoards* was principally derived from reports originally prepared for publication in the *Treasure Annual Report*, but the last hoards published in this form were those reported under the 1996 Treasure Act in 2008. In 2012 it was decided to publish summaries of hoards from England, Wales, Scotland, the Isle of Man, Northern Ireland, the Republic of Ireland and the Channel Islands in the *British Numismatic Journal* on an annual basis.

The hoards are listed in two sections, with the first section consisting of summaries of Roman hoards, and the second section providing more concise summaries of medieval and post-medieval hoards. In both sections the summaries include the place of finding, the date(s) of discovery, the suggested date(s) of deposition, and the number allocated to the hoard when it was reported under the terms of the Treasure Act (in England and Wales) or the laws of Treasure Trove (in Scotland). For reasons of space names of finders are omitted from the summary of medieval and post-medieval hoards. Reports on most of the English and Welsh hoards listed are available online from the Portable Antiquities Scheme (PAS) website: select the 'Search our database' bar under finds.org.uk/database, and type in the treasure case number without spaces (e.g. 2013T680).

Roman hoards**1. Dolphinholme, Lancs, Apr. 2014 (2014 T320)**

Dep.: Probably early years of Roman occupation.

Contents: Three silver *denarii* (struck 131–64 BC).

Note: PAS ID: LANCUM-4DC831.

Finder: Jim Newton, with a metal detector.

Disposition: Lancaster City Museum has expressed interest.

2. Pontsbury area, Shropshire, Sept. 2014 (2014 T633)

Dep.: Probably early years of Roman occupation.

Contents: Three silver *denarii*: Republic (70 and 47 BC), 2; Augustus (27 BC–AD 14), 1

Note: PAS ID: WMID-AABF61.

Finder: Marie Hunt, with a metal detector.

Disposition: No museum has expressed interest.

3. Malpas, Cheshire, Jan. 2014 (2014 T89)

Dep.: Probably early years of Roman occupation.

Contents: Seven Iron Age gold *staters* and 28 Roman silver *denarii*: *Staters*: Western gold EISV, 3; North Eastern gold VEP CORF, 4. *Denarii*: Roman Republic (types issued between 134–48 BC), 16; Julius Caesar (44 BC), 1; Octavian (42 BC), 1; Brutus (43–42 BC), 1; Mark Antony (31 BC), 1; Augustus (27 BC–AD 14), 2; Tiberius (AD 14–37), 6.

Note: The relative lack of wear on the Tiberian *denarii* supports a date soon after the Roman invasion. This dating is consistent with the likely dating of the Iron Age coins. PAS ID: LVPL-DFD9E1.

Finders: Alan Shilton and Robert Carter, with metal detectors.

Disposition: British Museum (for some material), the National Museums Liverpool, and Congleton Museum have all expressed interest.

4. South Norfolk area, July–Aug. 2013 (2014 T94, addenda to 2012 T810)

Dep.: Probably early years of Roman occupation.

Contents: 54 silver *denarii*: Roman Republic (types issued between 148–48 BC), 26; Julius Caesar (49–45 BC), 2; P. Clodius, (42 BC), 1; C. Vibius Varus (42 BC), 1; Octavian (32–29 BC), 1; Mark Antony (32–31 BC), 5; Augustus (27 BC–AD 14), 8; Tiberius (AD 14–37), 10.

Note: Addenda bring the hoard total to 113 *denarii* to AD 37. PAS ID: NMS-0F1E88.

Finder: John Paul Kineavy, with a metal detector.

Disposition: Norwich Castle Museum has expressed interest.

5. Colchester, Essex, Aug. 2014 (2014 T577)

Dep.: AD 60–61.

Contents: Roman jewellery, box and coins, the latter consisting of 22 silver and 3–4 copper-alloy (precise number still uncertain as they were in a corroded clump), only two *denarii* are so far legible as conservation work ongoing: Augustus (27 BC–AD 14), 2 (Lyon).

Note: PAS ID: ESS-058E5B. The other objects in the jewellery box consist of gold and silver bracelets, a silver chain, gold finger-rings, gold and pearl earrings, a lidded wooden box covered with thin silver sheet and set on ivory legs, a copper-alloy pendant, and a glass

intaglio. Some of the objects had been in the box when buried, and most of the coins had been buried in a leather or cloth bag or purse. Such a collection of precious metal jewellery and coins from a single archaeological context associated with the Boudican revolt has never before been found in Colchester, where the metal artefacts from the Boudican destruction levels are generally copper-alloy fragments of ordinary domestic or military items.

6. Dacorum, Herts, Aug. 2014 (2014 T669)

Dep.: AD 78 or later.

Contents: Four silver *denarii*: Republic (47 and 46 BC), 2; Mark Antony (32–31 BC), 1; Vespasian (AD 69–79), 1.

Note: PAS ID: BH-A74A1A.

Finder: Gregory Edmund, with a metal detector.

Disposition: Three Rivers Museum has expressed interest.

7. Kington, Herefordshire, Feb. 2014 (2014 T726, addenda to 2013 T500)

Dep.: 122 or later.

Contents: Three silver *denarii*: Nero (AD 54–68), 1; Vespasian (AD 69–79), 1; Trajan (AD 98–117), 1

Note: PAS ID: HESH-70C170. Find now totals 14 *denarii* to AD 122.

Finders: Alun Critcheon and Ian Cole, with metal detectors.

Disposition: Kington Museum has expressed interest.

8. Edgefield, Norfolk, July 2013 (2013 T617)

Dep.: 117–38 or later.

Contents: 17 *Æ dup.lasses* and one *Æ quadrans*: Claudius (AD 41–54), 1; possibly Nero (AD 64–68), 1; Vespasian (AD 69–79), 1; uncertain Flavian (AD 69–96), 3; Hadrian (117–38), 3 + 1 *quadrans*, illegible, 7.

Finder: Simon Gray, with a metal detector. PAS ID: NMS-3D9D54.

Disposition: No museums have expressed interest.

9. Charlwood, Surrey, Nov. 2014 (2014 T853, addenda to 2011 T297 and 2012 T847)

Dep.: c.161.

Contents: Two silver *denarii*: Hadrian (117–38), 1; Sabina, 1

Note: PAS ID: SUR-662748 and SUR-781104. This find is a second addenda to the 2011 find of two Iron Age coins, 13 Roman *denarii* and 6 objects with an end date of c.161 (2011 T297). The first addenda are 2012 T847 (5 Roman *denarii* and 1 *quinarius* to c.161).

Disposition: Surrey Archaeological Society has expressed acquisition interest.

10. Low Side Quarter, Cumbria, June 2014 (2014 T382, addenda to 2013 T480)

Dep.: c.161

Contents: Three silver *denarii*: Galba (AD 68–69), 1; Trajan (AD 98–117), 1; Sabina (128–38), 1

Note: PAS ID: LANCUM-5B5C83. Total now stands at 30 *denarii* to 161 (original find PAS ID: LANCUM-3A83C7).

Finder: Daniel Boakes, with a metal detector.

Disposition: Senhouse Roman Museum, Maryport has expressed acquisition interest.

11. Roxby, North Lincs, 1992 and June 1995 (pre-Treasure Act)

Dep.: 138–61 or later

Contents: 35 *dupondii/asses*: Claudius (AD 41–54), 2; Nero (AD 54–68), 3; Vespasian (AD 69–79), 5; Vespasian or Titus, 5; Titus (AD 79–81), 1; Domitian (AD 81–96), 7; Nerva (AD 96–98), 1; Trajan (AD 98–117), 2; Hadrian (117–38), 1; Antoninus Pius (138–61), 1; uncertain emperor, 7.

Note: Found scattered whilst metal detecting between 1992 and June 1995. 35 *dup./asses* form a coherent group (amongst a number of stray Roman coins finds and two small copper alloy objects (a dolphin-type brooch and a strap-end fragment)) and probably belong together as a hoard.

Finder(s): Name(s) withheld, with a metal detector.

Disposition: With finder(s); pre-Treasure Act case shown for recording purposes only.

12. Kings Cliffe, Northants, Jan. 2014 (2014 T150, addenda to 2011 T688)

Dep.: 141–61 or later.

Contents: Two silver *denarii* of Hadrian (117–38).

Note: PAS ID: NARC-350635. The original find of this Antonine *denarius* hoard consisted of 16 coins.

Finder(s): Radoslaw Runowski, with a metal detector.

Disposition: Disclaimed and returned to finder(s).

13. Belladrum, Kiltarlity, near Beaully, Inverness-shire (2012 and 2014 addenda)

Dep.: 161 or later.

Contents: 41 AR *denarii*: Domitian (AD 81–96), 7; Trajan (AD 98–117), 9; ? Trajan, 1; Hadrian (117–38), 9; Hadrian for Sabina, 1; Antoninus Pius (138–61), 4; Pius for Diva Faustina I, 4; Pius for Marcus Aurelius Caesar, 3; Pius for Faustina II, 2; Marcus Aurelius (AD 161–80), for Divus Antoninus Pius, 1.

Note: Ten coins from this hoard were reported previously (*NC* 171 (2011), 410). Four more were subsequently located by detector searching, and a further twenty-seven were recovered in the course of an archaeological excavation on the site of the original metal-detector finds, including the *denarius* of Divus Antoninus Pius, which pushes the date of deposition forward into the reign of Marcus Aurelius. It is intended that a full catalogue of the coins, together with an assessment of the possible significance of the hoard, should be included in the report on the excavation to be prepared by Dr Fraser Hunter, of National Museums Scotland.

Disposition: The earlier finds were claimed as Treasure Trove and allocated to Inverness Museum, and it is anticipated that the excavation finds will follow them there.

Dep.: 161–76 or later.

Contents: 30 silver *denarii*: Vitellius (AD 69), 1; Vespasian (AD 69–79), 1; Titus Caesar, 2; Domitian Caesar, 2; Nerva (AD 96–98), 1; Trajan (AD 98–117), 7; Hadrian (117–38), 3; Sabina, 1; Antoninus Caesar, 1; Antoninus Pius (138–61), 6; Diva Faustina I, 1; Marcus Caesar, 1; Divus Pius (161), 1; Lucius Verus (161–69), 1; Faustina II (161–76), 1.

Note: A Treasure Trove case reported many years later. PAS ID: WMID-1AC648.

Finder: Name withheld, with a metal detector.

15. Woodbridge area, Suffolk, Oct. 2014 (2014 T893, addendum to 2009 T622, 2012 T399 and 2012 T955)

Dep.: 172–76 or later.

Contents: Silver *denarius*: Divus Antoninus Pius (161), 1.

Note: PAS ID: EKE 022 1106. 22 coins from this Antonine *denarius* hoard have previously been recovered.

Finder: Terry Marsh, with a metal detector.

Disposition: No museum has expressed interest.

16. Acton, Cheshire, Dec. 2014 (2014 T966)

Dep.: c.198.

Contents: 5 silver *denarii* deposited within a lead cone shaped container with a lead disc stopper: All the *denarii* are of Septimius Severus (193–211), issued between 194 and 198.

Note: PAS ID: LVPL-15E376. The cast lead alloy container is conical with a sub-circular cross-section (45.18 mm length and 40.15 mm max. width; wt. 50.5 g). Lead alloy circular disc stopper: 25.28 mm diam., 5.32 mm thick; wt. 19.9 g.

17. Bottesford area, Lincs, 1997–2013 (2014 T288 addenda)

Dep.: 207 or later.

Contents: PAS ID: NLM-ADA762 etc. Four silver *denarii*: Otho (AD 69), 1; Diva Faustina I (141–61), 1; Aurelius Caesar (139–61), 1; Septimius Severus (193–211), 1

Note: The original find was a Severan *denarius* hoard (*tpq* 207) consisting of 165 coins (and eleven pottery sherds from a greyware globular jar). This was published by J. Williams and V. Rigby in *CHRB* XI, pp. 139–46. Another Severan *denarius* hoard in the same general area has been recorded separately under a different findspot name: Holme, Lincs (2003 T225), 408 AR *denarii* and a small grey ware jar or flagon to AD 209; hoard summary in *NC* 2006, pp. 368–9. Also declared from the same finder was a base silver radiate of Philip II as Caesar (244–47), however as this forms a very obvious outlier to the *denarius* hoard group it is treated as a stray find.

19. South Brent, Devon, May 2014 (2014 T312)

Dep.: 224 or later.

Contents: 11 *Æ sestertii*: Hadrian (117–38), 1; Antoninus Pius (138–61), 2; Aurelius Caesar, 1; Marcus Aurelius (161–80), 3; Faustina II, 2; Julia Domna (*Wars of the Succession*, AD 193–97), 1; Severus Alexander (222–35), 1
Note: Last coin is Severus Alexander TR P III (224). PAS ref.: DEV-37EC41.

Finder: Mark Ashley, with a metal detector.

Disposition: No museums have expressed interest. R.A.

20. Fangfoss, East Yorks., Nov. 2014 (2014 T905)

Dep.: 222–35 or later.

Contents: A fused lump of base silver *denarii*, at least seven coins – possibly burnt as they are deformed into a fused mass (total wt. 14.01 g). Three of the coins can be identified as of Severus Alexander (222–35) but further details are uncertain due to the condition of the coins.
Note: PAS ID: YORYM-6C737B.

Finder: Anthony Feetenby, with a metal detector.

Disposition: No museum has expressed interest. R.A.

21. West Knoyle, Wilts., Mar.–Aug. 2014 (2014 T194)

Dep.: 222–35 or later.

Contents: Six base silver *denarii*: Septimius Severus (193–211), 2; Julia Domna, 2; Julia Maesa (under Elagabalus, 218–22), 1; Severus Alexander (222–35), 1
Note: PAS ID: SOM-D0A907. Further Roman coins found in the fields to the east of the hoard are treated as single losses and recorded on the PAS database.

Finder(s): Name(s) withheld, with a metal detector.

Disposition: Disclaimed and returned to finder(s). R. We./L.B./S.M.

22. Riddlesden, West Yorks, Mar.–Apr. 2014 (2014 T151)

Dep.: c. 238.

Contents: 110 silver *denarii*: Domitian Caesar (AD 69–79), 1; Trajan (AD 98–117), 3; Hadrian (117–38), 5; Antoninus Pius (138–61), 5; Diva Faustina I, 2; Faustina II, 1; Marcus Aurelius (161–80), 7; Lucius Verus (161–69), 2; Faustina II, 1; Commodus (180–92), 4; Divus Antoninus, 1; Septimius Severus (*Wars of the Succession*, 193–97), 2; Septimius Severus (*Joint reign of Severus and Caracalla*, 198–209), 13; Caracalla, 9; Julia Domna, 5; Geta Caesar, 8; Plautilla, 3; Septimius Severus (*Joint reign of Severus and Caracalla/Geta*, 198–211), 1; Septimius Severus (*Joint reign of Severus, Caracalla and Geta*, 209–11), 2; Geta, 1; Caracalla (211–17), 7; Julia Domna, 2; Elagabalus (218–22), 4; Julia Maesa, 2; Severus Alexander (222–35), 7; Julia Mamaea, 1; Maximinus I (235–38), 2; Uncertain emperor/empress, 9.
Note: PAS ID SWYOR-810366. Those coins might possibly be remnants of an antiquarian discovery reported from the same general area: the Bingley (Elam) Hoard (RBCH 434). That hoard, discovered in 1775, consists of ‘many hundreds’ of *denarii* (possibly including a few radiates) from Nero (AD 54–68) to Pupienus (238) buried in a copper alloy box or chest. It

is possible that some of the coins are held by Leeds Museum Service.

Finder: Name withheld, with a metal detector. Subsequent archaeological investigation carried out by West Yorkshire Archaeology Advisory Service.

Dep.: 238–44 or later.

Contents: Eight silver *denarii* and 66 *Æ sestertii* fractions: *denarii*: Augustus (27 BC–AD 14), 1; Tiberius (AD 14–37), 1; Galba (AD 68–69), 1; Vespasian (AD 69–79), 1; Trajan (AD 98–117), 2; Marcus Aurelius (161–80), 1; Lucilla, 1. *Sestertii* fractions: Vespasian (AD 69–79), 2; Trajan (AD 98–117), 3 (incl 1 *as*); Antoninus Pius (138–61), 1; Diva Faustina I, 2; Marcus Aurelius (161–80), 3; Lucius Verus, 1; Aurelius or Verus, 1; Lucilla, 1; Diva Faustina II, 1; Lucilla or Faustina II, 1; Commodus (180–92), 1; uncertain Antonine Empress, 2; Septimius Severus (193–211), 3; Julia Domna, 1; uncertain Severan Emperor, 1 (*as*); Gordian III (238–44), 1 (*as*); uncertain emperor, 41 (incl 19 *dup./asses*).

Note: 20 radiates/*nummi* dating to the third and fourth centuries AD were also recovered but are very unlikely to be part of the hoard. Also a gold *aureus* of Trajan was previously found nearby. PAS ID: BH-80B838. Acquired by Lowewood Museum (reg. no. 2014.0216). A number of non-coin artefacts were also recovered but were not considered related to the hoard and will appear on the PAS database.

Contents: 22 *denarii* and 29 radiates: *denarii*: uncertain Antonine (161–80), 1; Caracalla (198–217), 3; Elagabalus (218–22), 4; Severus Alexander (222–35), 14; radiates: Gordian III (238–44), 2; Philip I (244–49), 2; Otacilia Severa, 1; Decius (249–51), 2; Valerian I (253–60), 3; Gallienus (joint reign, 253–60), 1; Salonina (joint reign, 253–60), 1; Gallienus (sole reign, 260–68), 1; *Gallie Empire*: Postumus (260–69), 10; Victorinus (269–71), 1; emperor illegible, 5

Note: PAS ID: BERK-AD7AE7. Original find (BERK-3E4286) consisted of 5 *denarii* and 11 radiates (same *tpq*).

Contents: 1 irregular *as*, 1 *sestertius*, 1 base silver *denarius* and 7,555 radiates: irregular *as*: Claudius I (AD 41–54), 1. *Sestertius*: Marcus Aurelius (161–80), 1. *Denarius*: Septimius Severus (*Wars of the Succession*, 193–97), 1. Radiates: Gordian III (238–44), 1; Philip I (244–49), 1; Decius (249–51), 1; Herennia Etruscilla, 1; Trebonianus Gallus (251–53), 4; Valerian I (253–60), 107; Gallienus (joint reign, 253–60), 45; Uncertain

(Valerian or Gallienus), 1, Salonina (joint reign, 253–60), 60, Valerian II, 4; Divus Valerian II, 12; Saloninus Caesar, 10; Saloninus Augustus, 1; Gallienus (Sole reign, 260–68), 1359; Salonina, 100; Claudius II (268–70), 762; Divus Claudius II, 66; Quintillus (270), 121; Aurelian (270–75), 52; Postumus (260–69), 772; Laelian (269), 23; Marius (269), 81; Victorinus (269–71), 3, 296; Tetricus I (271–74), 526; Tetricus II, 112; Uncertain Gallic emperor, 3; Emperor illegible, 1; Irregular radiates, 33

Note: PAS ID: SOM-B7CA61. A single Claudian copy in wretched condition was amongst irregular radiates in the hoard. Latest Aurelian coin is of the fourth series at Milan (274). The *sestertius* of Marcus Aurelius had fused through corrosion to a plain copper alloy ring (3.60 g; max diam. 26 mm).

Contents: 336 BI radiates, mostly irregular: Gallienus (260–68), 5; Claudius II (268–70), 8; Divus Claudius (270), 7; Tetricus I (271–74), 9; Tetricus II, 4; Uncertain Gallic, 1; irregular, 293; uncertain emperor, 9

Note: The coins were contained within eight fragments of a coarse ware jar consisting of base and seven body sherds. PAS ID: SUSS-C9B421.
